Dr. Muhamad Na'im Bin Ab Razak is a Malaysian physician, prolific writer, and outdoor enthusiast. He obtained his Doctor of Medicine (MD) from Universiti Sains Malaysia in 2011. He later completed his Membership (MRCEM, 2021) and Fellowship (FRCEM, 2023) examinations under the Royal College of Emergency Medicine, United Kingdom. Dr. Na'im also holds multiple international fellowships, including the Fellowship of Extreme & Wilderness Medicine (FEWM) from the World Extreme Medicine Society (2022), the Fellow of the Academy of Wilderness Medicine (FAWM) from the Wilderness Medical Society, USA (2023), and the Fellow of the Faculty of Remote, Rural, and Humanitarian Health (FRRHHEd) from the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh (2025).

He currently serves as a Senior Registrar in the Emergency and Trauma Department at Hospital Lahad Datu, Sabah. Beyond clinical practice, he is the founder of the Wilderness EMS Sabah Team (2015), co-founder and current Vice President of the Wilderness & Austere Medicine Society of Malaysia (WAMS), and a founding member of the Wilderness Medicine Special Interest Group (SIG) under the College of Emergency Physicians Malaysia.

Dr. Na'im is also an active researcher under the WESTPAC Harmful Jellyfish Initiative, focusing on the venom proteomics and clinical toxinology of the box jellyfish (Chironex yamaguchii). His multidisciplinary work bridges emergency medicine, wilderness and austere care, marine toxinology, and public education—reflecting his passion for advancing Malaysia's frontier in wilderness and marine medicine.
